Agenda Item: Consider Recommendation on Regulations for Electric Dockless Scooters

Date: August 13, 2019

Overview – Please provide a summary of the agenda item along with bullet points highlighting the main items and key issues.

Most Shorewood residents by now have recognized the electric rental scooters returned to the Milwaukee area. The City of Milwaukee is initiating a dockless scooter pilot study to observe, solicit feedback, and evaluate the effectiveness of dockless scooters. The pilot will run through December 31, 2019.

Dockless scooters have the potential to increase transportation options, expand access to transit, and provide municipalities an opportunity to further review access to the public right of way. Lime is the current dockless scooter operator working with the City of Milwaukee on the pilot program.

At the Village Board meeting this past Monday, it was requested for the Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Committee to review and consider recommending potential regulations for the electric dockless scooters. Specifically, the committee will review the following ways to regulate the scooters in Shorewood:

- Restrict or prohibit their operation on roadways with speed limits greater than 25 mph.
- Restrict or prohibit their operation on sidewalks.
- Establish limitations on where they may be parked. For this item, review the Lime parking standards to understand their requirements for parking (<https://help.li.me/hc/en-us/articles/115004745967-Parking>).
- Restrict or prohibit short-term commercial rental to the general public.

The Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Committee will review these potential regulations and propose recommendations for the Village Board to consider in September or October. Committee members should encourage the public to provide feedback to Village Manager Rebecca Ewald at 414-847-2701 or via email at rewald@villageofshorewood.org.

I recommend implementing the following regulations on electric dockless rental scooters:

1A – Do not restrict operation on roadways with speed limits greater than 25 mph.

OR

1B – Restrict operation on roadways with speed limits greater than 25 mph.

2A – Do not restrict operation on sidewalks.

OR

2B – Restrict operation on sidewalks.

3 – The following locations should be restricted from any parked scooters: (list locations)

4A – Electric dockless rental scooters is prohibited in the Village of Shorewood.

OR

4B – Electric dockless rental scooters is permitted in the Village of Shorewood. The Village Board should enter into an agreement with electric dockless rental scooter businesses and require a permit fee for the scooters.

OR

4C – Electric dockless rental scooters is permitted in the Village of Shorewood as a pilot program through December 31, 2019. The Committee will review with the Village Board, community groups, and other municipalities prior to full implementation in 2020. The Village Board should enter into an agreement with electric dockless rental scooter businesses and require a permit fee for the scooters.
