1. Keep grass, leaves and yard waste out of the streets and sewers.
2. Pick-up pet waste. Its nitrogen and phosphorous add to algae growth.
3. Test your soil and only sparingly use the appropriate fertilizer.
4. Reduce stormwater runoff from your property - divert rain water to lawns, gardens and rain barrels.
5. Take used motor oil and anti-freeze to a recycling center or Shorewood DPW if you're a resident.
