

HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

This book lists Village of Shorewood ordinances that are commonly cited and used. Seldom-used ordinances are also listed for reference and for those rare occasions requiring a citation. Forfeitures indicated by this book lie between the minimum and maximum limits set by the Village Code and are intended to set a uniform and fair bond for violations of these ordinances with respect to nature and gravity of the offense and repeated violations, if any.

Ordinances are arranged by chapter number as they appear in the Village Code. The far-left column lists the chapter and section number. Applicable subsection numbers may be shown in that or the center column or within the text of the ordinance. A general description of the ordinance or ordinance subsection violation appears in the center column. When issuing a citation for a violation, start with the chapter, section, and then the appropriate subsection(s), working from left to right. For example, transient merchants calling at the rear door of any dwelling place would be cited as 480-7A(1)(c).

Deposits for violations generally appear in the far-right columns, some with deposits increasing in amount for repeat offenses. Deposits for violations involving a property value appear in a matrix table beneath the description of the ordinance. For some violations within the same ordinance, deposits may differ, so check carefully for the proper section/subsection and its corresponding deposit

For ordinance sections with deposits listed for first, second, and third violations of that particular ordinance, check the record of the person being cited and count all like or similar violations of the sort being cited for which the person has been charged within five years. Indicate the deposit accordingly (e.g., it would be a third fireworks violation under 29402A if the person has two previous violations for similar conduct on his/her record). Note that for a second or subsequent violation of a particular law, it is not necessary to know the amount of the previous loss or losses. Consider only what number the offense you are citing is and its monetary value.

For violations with a matrix table listed in the deposit schedule (primarily theft and damage violations), find the proper column for the monetary loss (estimated or known) then find the corresponding row indicating the number of the offense.

Note that this schedule lists in the “Forfeiture” column (second from right) the base monetary penalty for violation of the ordinance. The “Total” column (farthest right) then lists the sum of the Forfeiture plus court costs and state-mandated assessments and fees.¹ In a matrix, the number on the left within a cell indicates the base Forfeiture while the number on the right indicates the Total deposit amount. **Indicate the Total amount as the deposit on the citation.**

For violations not listed in this deposit schedule or for which no deposit amount is listed, such as truancy or building code or property maintenance violations, the citation shall include “**Must Appear**” in the section on the citation for entry of Total Deposit.

¹ As of the adoption of this deposit schedule in June 2024, the added fees and costs consist of a penalty assessment (26% of the Forfeiture amount), a drug/crime prevention fee (\$13), a jail assessment (the greater of \$10 or 1% of the Forfeiture), and court costs (\$38 (the maximum currently allowed)). The Village retains the Forfeiture and court costs and transmits other assessments and fees to the appropriate authorities.

The **Forfeiture** column in this Deposit Schedule lists the monetary penalty for violation of the Ordinance. The **Total** column includes the mandatory court costs and fees (including the 26% Penalty assessment, \$13 Crime Lab fee, \$10 (or 1% if greater) Jail Assessment, and \$38 Court Costs (maximum allowed by the state)) added to the forfeiture.

Chapter 389 Nuisances

For 389-8, 389-11, and 389-12, officers may take enforcement action for violations of the Village Code which come within the jurisdiction of the Police Department. Violations which fall within the jurisdiction of the Building Inspector, Director of Public Works, or the Health Officer shall be documented and referred to the proper office, with copies of the referral forwarded to the Village Manager and the Chief of Police. For the following violations which fall within the jurisdiction of the Police Department, warning should normally first be given to violator (document by means of Miscellaneous Contact or certified letter) to correct violation within 24 hours of receipt of said warning/notice. For those violations which may require immediate action, citation may be issued upon initial observation of violation without prior warning, and appropriate action taken to immediately abate the violation. A copy of any citation or warning issued, and a report of any immediate abatement action taken, shall be forwarded as soon as possible to the Village Manager's office.
