Recyclables are collected curbside every other week by Waste Management, under contract with the Village of Shorewood. For route and schedule information, please visit www.villageofshorewood.org/Collections

All materials must be placed inside the recycling cart. Material outside of the cart will not be collected.

Recycling Center - Weekday Materials

All materials collected curbside may also be disposed of at the DPW recycling center free of charge during the below hours. Waste oil is also accepted during these hours.

DPW Recycling Center - Saturday Materials and Hours

The DPW Recycling Center is also open to residents on the following Saturdays:
April through November - the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

December through March - the 1st Saturday of the month from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

except when a major holiday falls in the weekend

On Saturdays (only), the additional materials below are also accepted for recycling:



ELECTRONICS

If it has a cord, it can be recycled! Charges apply.



TIRES

A per tire charge will apply.



VEHICLE BATTERIES

Vehicle batteries are accepted at no charge.

The "chasing arrows" symbol doesn't necessarily mean it's recyclable.



Plastic bags cannot be recycled. All recycle placed in your cart should be loose or in paper bags.

Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard

Flatten and recycle all cardboard and paperboard. Pizza boxes are recyclable once food and any liners have been removed.

Paper and Paper Cups

Paper, newspaper, magazines, and empty paper cups are good to recycle. Soggy paper products should be placed in the garbage or compost. Shredded paper can also be recycled, just be sure to put it all into a paper bag and roll the top closed.

Plastic Bottles, Cups, & Containers

Recycle plastic based on the type of item: bottles, jars, jugs, cups, and tubs can be recycled. Empty and dry containers, then put the cap or lid back on before tossing in the bin. No foam or compostable cups.

Food & Beverage Containers

Recycle empty tin, aluminum, steel, and glass cans and jars. Be sure to rinse and let dry before placing in the recycle container.
